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### 2341.1 DRILL MASTER

Under the direction of the Academy Director, the Drill Master is responsible for the day-to-day management of the academy.

### 2341.2 ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- (a) Responsible for the training of Academy staff members
- (b) Monitoring all staff activities including adjunct instructors to ensure appropriate and effective delivery of curriculum and compliance to academy rules and local and state laws regarding inappropriate conduct, including but not limited to discrimination, harassment, and violence in the work place
- (c) Promoting a positive work environment
- (d) Conducting periodic staff/instructor performance reviews
- (e) Scheduling and conducting training exercise for Drill Instructors ensuring consistent delivery of curriculum
- (f) Scheduling and conducting staff meetings as needed to provide support for academy staff and to review issues relevant to Recruits including but not limited to performance and discipline
- (g) Responsible for recommending formal levels of discipline including issuance of Letters of Unsatisfactory Performance and release from the Academy
- (h) Communicating with designated contacts of participating agencies of scheduling, Recruits performance, or other relevant issues
- (i) Submit a written summary of Academy operations (both curriculum and financial) at the conclusion of the Academy

### 2341.3 ADDITIONAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- (a) Prepares materials, demonstrations, exercises, and evaluations for assigned class
- (b) Administers and provides security for grades. Records certification and performance examinations
- (c) Acts to prevent and/or control unacceptable student behavior in classrooms and laboratories

#### 2341.4.2 ABILITY TO:

Lecture in front of large groups of students

Explain the subject material in a clear, logical and concise fashion

Interact effectively with students, peers and JPA administration and staff

Work independently to solve problems

Maintain integrity, honesty, reliability and cooperation

Adhere to all policies of the JPA

#### 2341.4.3 AGE:

Must be at least 21 years of age

#### 2341.4.4 KNOWLEDGE OF:

Fire/Rescue/EMS Technology practices and processes

Teaching practices, methods and techniques

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Current trends in the subject matter including theory and research

### 2341.4.5 PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Maintain physical ability and stamina to meet the essential job functions and perform the following, with or without reasonable accommodation:

- (a) Stand, sit, walk and turn to deliver lectures, other instruction, or instruction materials, deliver lectures
- (b) Work in the confines of a classroom and or Drill Ground environment
- (c) Reach overhead to operate equipment, lift, push, pull stoop, squat, bend and carry (up to maximum of 50 lbs.)
- (d) Move and operate equipment and prepare laboratory materials
- (e) Utilize manual and finger dexterity to operate equipment, computers and prepare laboratory materials
- (f) Utilize hearing to respond to student questions, normal conversation, telephone calls
- (g) Utilize vision, near and far, to read written materials, computer screens and to operate equipment
- (h) Shall not pose a direct threat to self, other individuals in the work place or the public
